

## Mac OS 8.11 – 9.2 Dialup & Email Settings

1. To begin, quit all programs and return to the Desktop.

3. Double click on the **Hard Drive Icon**, usually in the top right corner of the desktop.

4. Inside the window for the Hard Drive, there should be an **Assistants Folder**, double click on it.



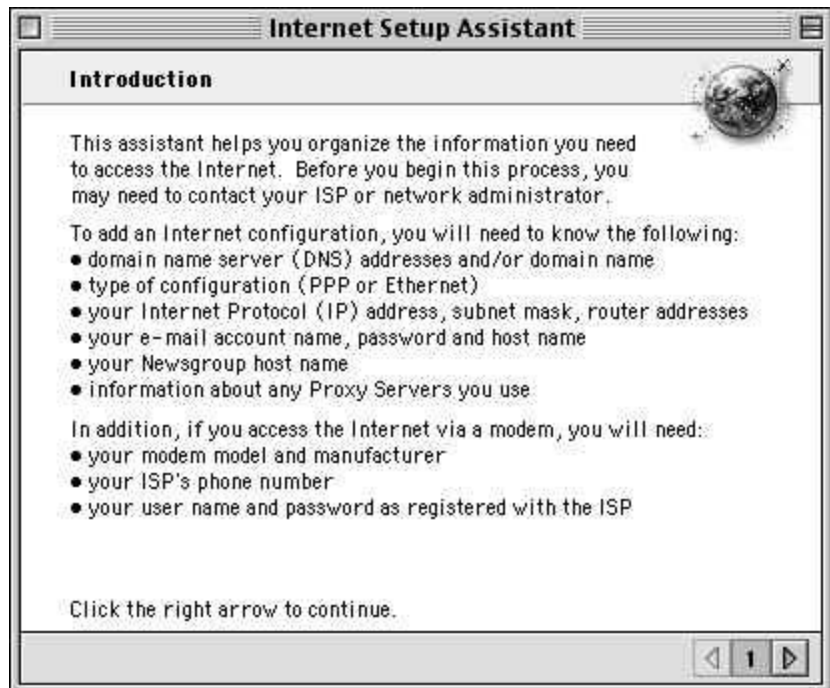
5. Inside the **Assistants** Window there should be an Alias to the **Internet Setup Assistant**, double click on it.



6. Click **Yes**.



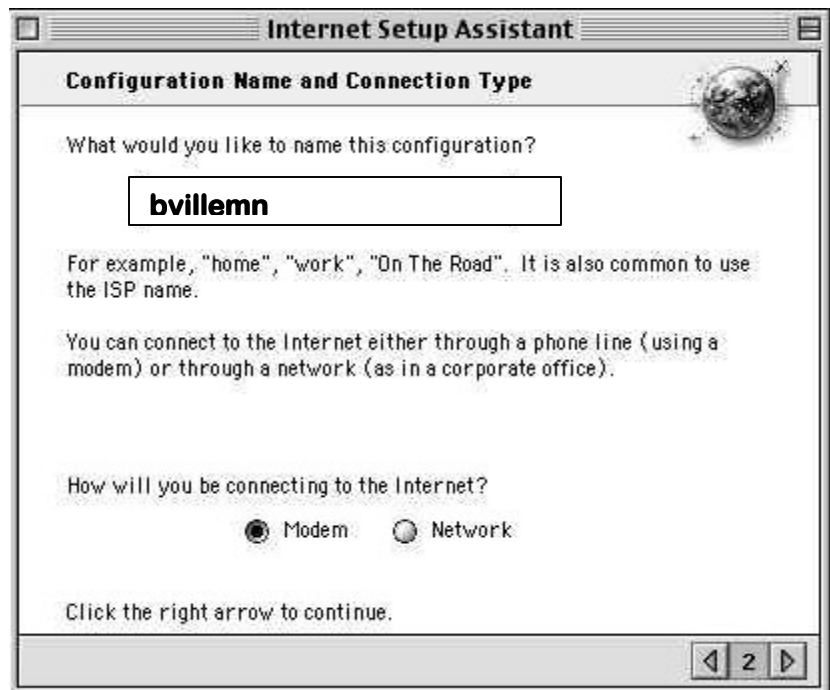
7. Click the **right arrow**.



8. Here, enter **bvillemn** for the name of the connection.

9. Make sure **Modem** is selected below.


10. Click the **right arrow**.



11. Make sure that the type of modem you have is selected on the **Modem** line, and that the port that it is connected to is selected on the **Port** line.

12. Select the type of phone line you have, **Tone** or **Pulse** (usually tone).

13. Click the **right arrow**.





14. Enter 354-2220 for the phone number.

15. Enter your **username** and **password**

16. Click the **right arrow**.

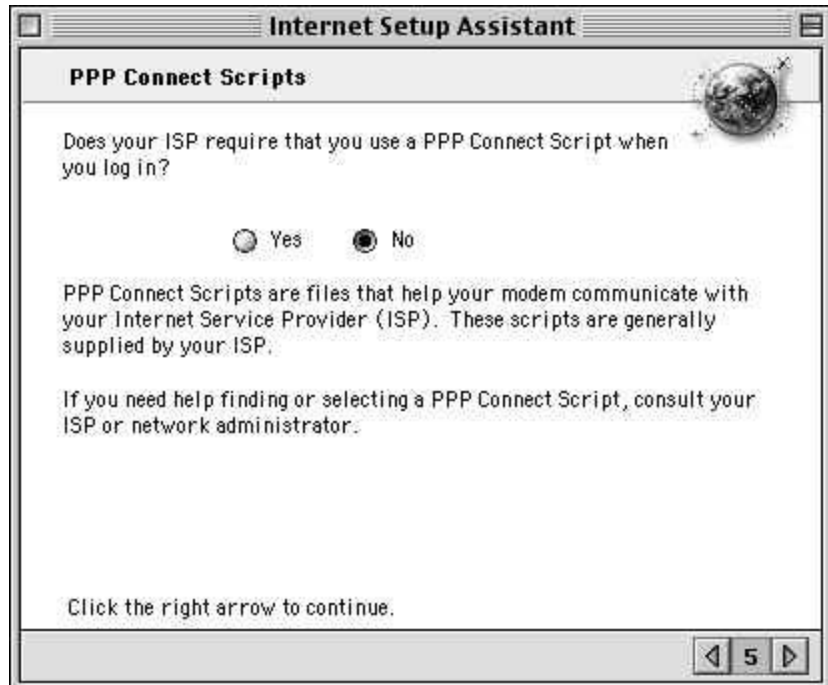

17. Select **No**.

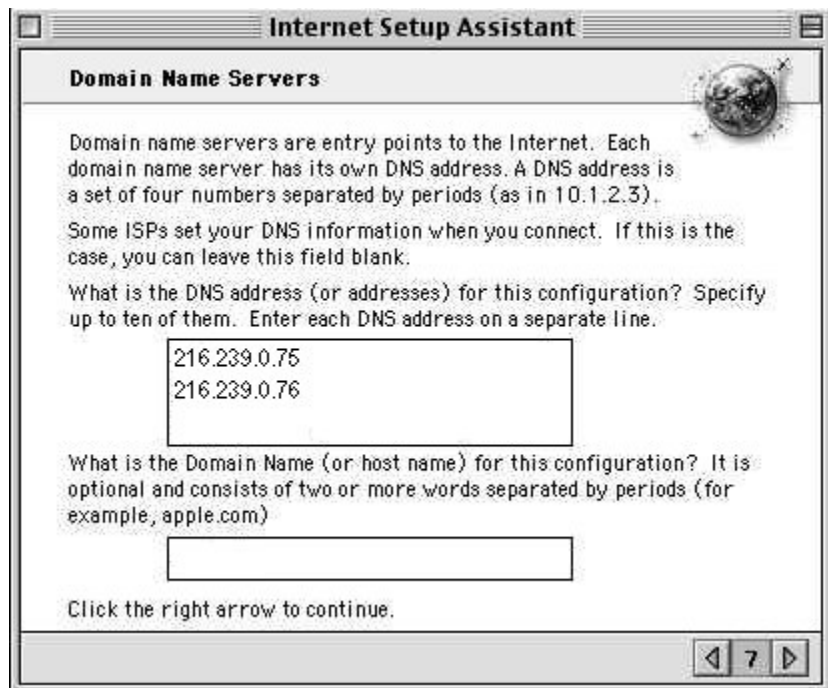
18. Click the **right arrow**.



19. For the **DNS** addresses, enter **216.239.0.75** and **216.239.0.76**.

20. Leave the **domain name** blank.

21. Click the **right arrow**.



22. Fill in your **E-mail address**.

23. Enter your e-mail **password**.

24. Click the **right arrow**.

25. You should enter the username followed by @pop.bvillemn.net in the first field, followed by the mail server of smtp.bvillemn.net in the second blank.

26. Click the **right arrow**.

27. If you would like to sign up for a newsgroup, enter **news.bvillemn.net** into this field.

28. Click the **right arrow**.



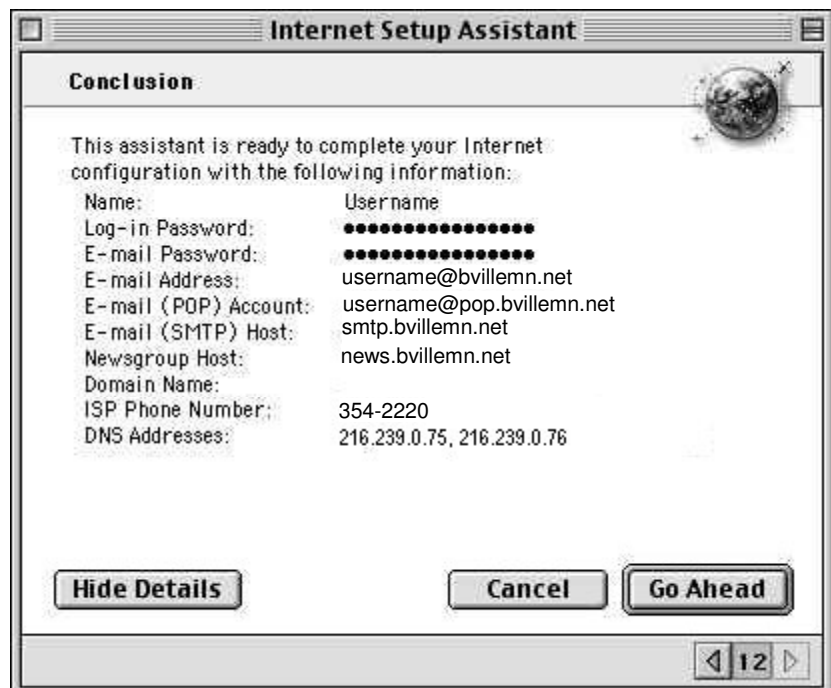
29. Select **No** and click the **right arrow**.



Click on **Go Ahead**.



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You will then see a screen that says Adding Configuration and then Finishing... When the Assistant is finished, you will be returned to the Desktop.

You should now be able to log in to the service by launching one of your Internet programs, or by using the Remote Access Control Panel in the Control Panels (in the Apple Menu), or the Remote Access Status Application in the Apple Menu.
